



STRONELAIRE AND DUNMAGLASS SCHOLARSHIP FUND GUIDANCE

What is the Stronelaire and Dunmaglass Scholarship Fund and who does it benefit?

Stronelaire and Dunmaglass wind farms are two joint ventures owned by SSE Renewables and Greencoat UK Wind Plc located in the Highland Region. Stronelaire a 228 MW wind farm south east of Fort Augustus and Dunmaglass a 94 MW wind farm south of Inverness are located within The Highland Council area. This fund is in addition to the community funding programmes supported by both wind farms.

Stronelaire and Dunmaglass wind farms provides scholarships of £5,500 to students undertaking STEM degrees. The scholarship is to be used towards the scholar's student loan, thereby reducing the amount for repayment at time of graduation. 2 awards will be made to different students every year for the duration of the fund programme.

What are the application timescales?

The fund opens once a year for applications on **1st June**. The deadline for applications to be considered is **13th September**.

Who can apply for funding?

To be considered for the Stronelaire and Dunmaglass Scholarship Fund applicants must have a home address (we will refer to this as your Registered) in one of the following community council areas:

- Stratherrick and Foyers
- Strathdearn
- Strathnairn
- Laggan
- Fort Augustus and Glenmoriston
- Spean Bridge, Roy Bridge and Achnacarry
- Glengarry

Scholarship Fund Criteria

The fund will make awards based on:

- Applicant demonstrating that at least 50% of their course is spent undertaking **STEM** subjects.
- Applicants demonstrating that they are currently undertaking a degree at a UK University or equivalent at college in the academic year.
- Priority will be given to applicants closest to the wind farm's primary site.





You will be informed of the outcome (successful or unsuccessful) of your application by the end of September, however, due to the high volume of anticipated applications, feedback will not be given.

Stronelairst & Dunmaglass Scholarship Fund Terms and Conditions:

- The Stronelairst Wind Farm and Dunmaglass Wind Farm decision is final.
- Each Scholarship is for the named person on the application only.
- The funding will be paid directly to the Student Loans Company to support your costs during study.
- The Scholar must take part in the promotion of this Scholarship and may be asked to participate in having their photograph taken and providing a personal statement for use in promotional material. The Scholar's personal data (email address, phone number and postal address) will be retained by SSE Renewables and will only be used for purposes related to the Scholarship.
- If requested the Scholar must attend a Scholarships & Awards Ceremony (date and location to be confirmed) to be formally presented with the award.
- The scholar commits to informing, SSE Renewables of their job and sector on completion of their degree.
- The Scholar should commence their programme of study during the agreed academic year. Authorised postponements will be considered only in exceptional circumstances.
- SSE Renewables reserves the right to investigate and possibly withdraw a person from the Scholarship programme if there is adequate proven evidence of illegal activities discovered.
- SSE Renewables reserves the right to make reasonable changes to this contract at any time and will advise the Scholar if this occurs, as and when required.
- You can only receive one scholarship from the fund.

What does the fund support?

Stronelairst and Dunmaglass wind farms provides scholarships to students from the immediate area surrounding the wind farms to undertaking **STEM** degrees. The scholarship grant is to be used towards the scholar's student loan, thereby reducing the amount for repayment at time of graduation. Two awards of £5,500 will be made to students who are undertaking a Higher education at a UK University or College.

How to apply

Applications to the Stronelairst and Dunmaglass Scholarship Fund are made through an online application form. To access this, please follow the link below:

You will be asked to confirm your eligibility to apply to the Fund and will then need to create a user account for the Community Investment Portal, if you have not already done so, or login if you already have an account.

Eligibility check list

We will ask you to tick yes or no to the following questions to establish eligibility:





- Do you have a home address in one of the seven community council areas served by the Stronelaire & Dunmaglass Scholarship Fund? (we will refer to this as your Registered Address)
- Will you be in receipt of a loan from the Student Loans Company for the academic year following your application for a scholarship?
- Are you taking a STEM based course, on a full time or part time basis, at a UK college or university in the academic year following your application for a scholarship?
- I confirm that I have not been in receipt of a Stronelaire and Dunmaglass Scholarship before.
 - If the above applies, please answer 'yes'.

About the online application process

The following guidance may help you in completing the application form:

- You must create a user account (using the application form link above) in order to access and submit a grant application.
- Your draft application will save at key points, so you can log out of the portal and resume drafting it when you log back in, should you not wish to complete and submit it in one session. Log back in [here](#) and click the 'My Applications' button on the home screen, then 'launch' next to your draft application. Please do not use this same login page to create your user account - this must be done through the application link (above).

Note: you will need to register this information the first time you apply for a grant, and it will remain on the portal for any future applications.

Documents to upload

We will ask you to upload the following documents during the application process, please ensure you have them to hand:

- Proof of your registered address e.g. a recent bank statement, driving licence or university / school letter.
 - (This is required at time of application)
- A copy of your account details with the Student Loan's Company (if already established).
 - This can be supplied at a later date if not available at time of application.
- Proof of your acceptance onto your selected higher education course.
 - This is required at time of application.
- A letter of reference specifically for this Scholarship. Your reference letter should be written by someone who knows you (the applicant) well in either an academic or professional capacity.
 - This can be supplied at a later date if not available at time of application.
