## SSE puts communities at the heart of its work, sharing value with those who host its energy assets.

Across our business, we deliver a diverse portfolio of community investment initiatives that strengthen local capacity, support co development, and create lasting social impact. By working hand-in-hand with communities, we support local projects that not only leave a lasting legacy but also ensure that people have the resources they need for today.

## Social impact

We are committed to capturing the social value of our community investment. It is vital that the electricity sector can demonstrate the positive social impact investing in communities has. There are a number of key actions within our social impact approach:

- Building open and trusted relationships with grant holders where impact measurement is fair and proportionate.
- Ensuring our in-house community team includes qualified social value practitioners who are skilled in supporting communities to capture their value.
- Guaranteeing every project funded identifies how it supports the UN Sustainable Development Goals.
- Utilising a value-based social impact measurement approach to capture and maximise the value created for communities.

## Funding principles

We are committed to creating value for society. The following common principles guide us in delivering impactful community investment funds.



### Sharing value

**Scholarship funds** – supporting local students undertaking STEM degrees to ensure local regions have the workforce of tomorrow.



**All Island fund** – supporting communities to deliver innovative projects that enhance the Green Transition, creating lasting social impacts for society and the environment.

## Mapping, Measuring and Understanding Impact

SSE Community Investment on the island of Ireland maps funded activity through two strategic objectives and four priority UN Sustainable Development Goals.

To be eligible, projects must show meaningful alignment with at least one priority UN SDG. This approach shows how local projects contribute to wider social, environmental and economic outcomes, while keeping investment focused on community priorities.

# SSE Renewables

## Supporting communities has been at the heart of SSE’s investment in renewable energy.

The company operates some of the largest community investment programmes in Ireland and Northern Ireland, which include local community funds, major project funds for larger regional impact and scholarship funding. Since 2001, when the company launched its first-ever wind-powered community fund at Coreen Wind Farm in County Cavan, SSE has awarded €13.9 million (to 31 March 2025) in funding investment to communities across Ireland. In Northern Ireland, SSE has awarded £4.8m million since 2008 (to 31 March 2025) to local communities when it launched its first-ever community fund in the region at Bessy Bell Wind Farm in County Tyrone.

## Growing connection in urban communities



£4,500  
awarded from  
Tievenameenta Fund



A key foundation of sustainable, resilient places is ensuring communities have access to inclusive, safe green space. Supporting local initiatives improves wellbeing and strengthens community connections.

The Forge Family Resource Centre has transformed a hilltop urban space on the border of Fermanagh and Donegal into a vibrant community garden. Funding enabled local residents to access upskilling courses and provided essential equipment, seeds and plants.

In an area with limited green space, the project goes beyond food growing to foster connection. Sessions provide a valued social outlet, bringing together participants from both sides of the Border to learn and support one another. The garden produces fruit and vegetables for the local community, while a bug hotel enhances biodiversity. What began as a training initiative has become a welcoming, shared space that supports a greener, more inclusive and connected place to live.

## Brewing brighter futures



€35,000  
awarded from the Cavan  
Monaghan Community Fund

Brew for Better is a youth-led mobile coffee training programme supporting young people across Cavan and Monaghan to build confidence, practical skills and routes into employment or further learning.

Delivered by Youth Work Ireland Cavan Monaghan, the programme will establish a fully equipped mobile coffee truck as a hands-on training environment. Over three years, around 50 young people will complete barista and food safety training, gain supervised work experience and take part in paid youth participation shifts.

The project will also create a visible community asset, bringing coffee, connection and inclusive activity to local events and rural communities. Trading income will be



reinvested into programme delivery, helping the model become sustainable while supporting youth employability, community participation and environmental awareness.

## Launching the Yellow River Community Fund



€214,400

awarded from the Yellow River Community Fund

Yellow River Wind Farm, located in County Offaly in Ireland’s Midlands, comprises 29 turbines and boasts an installed capacity of 101MW. The associated community fund is the first from SSE to be delivered under Ireland’s Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS). In alignment with the Irish Government’s delivery guidelines, the Fund was shaped through comprehensive community consultation to determine funding priorities, with decisions made by a locally representative panel.

### The fund is structured around three core elements:

- Local fund:** Provides support for smaller-scale community initiatives, with an emphasis on energy efficiency, safety, environmental and social sustainability, as well as education and skills development.
- Major projects fund:** Targets larger, transformational projects that drive local development and sustainability.

- Near neighbour fund:** A fixed annual payment of €1,000 to residents living within 1km radius of the wind farm.

The initial awards from the fund supported 20 local projects. Notable examples include Ballinabrackey GAA Club, which received funding to redevelop its facilities, and North Offaly Community Development Network CLG, which received funding to deliver a Meals on Wheels service to vulnerable residents. The fund’s commitment to education and skills was demonstrated through support for Rhode STEAM Club, facilitating workshops for young people in Rhode and the surrounding area. Community energy efficiency was also prioritised by the local panel, with St Ciarán’s NS benefiting from an expanded solar panel provision. SSE’s community investment team continues to deliver workshops and mentoring in the area of benefit, fostering capacity building and ensuring a pipeline of impactful local projects for future funding rounds.



## Revitalising rural facilities



€30,000

awarded from West Limerick North Kerry Community Fund



In the heart of Moyvane village, a disused Garda Barracks has been transformed into a welcoming, multi-purpose community hub. Fáilte Isteach Gach Duine Moyvane CLG has reimagined the building as a vibrant space for people of all ages and backgrounds. SSE community funding provided both the seed funding for a feasibility study and the final capital support needed to bring the project to life.

The revitalised hub includes a small café and tearoom, offering a warm, social space for residents to meet while generating income to sustain the facility. Designed as a flexible, community-first space, the hub will host local groups, educational courses, workshops and exhibitions. In addition, a new standalone building was installed for the Moyvane Men’s Shed providing a space for skill-sharing and social connection.

In a rural village where amenities are limited, the project fosters inclusion, reduces isolation and encourages active participation in community life. By bringing people together in a shared space, it supports a more connected, vibrant and sustainable community.

## Supporting growth in women’s sport



€10,000

awarded from Cavan and Monaghan Community Fund

With support from the SSE Renewables Cavan and Monaghan Community Fund, Corduff Ladies GFC has installed a dedicated portacabin dressing room at its grounds in Corduff, providing a safe, private, and reliable space for players and visiting teams.

Previously, the club relied on shared access to men’s facilities, which became increasingly challenging as participation grew to around 200 members across teams from U12 to Senior level. At times, players were left without access to a private space, impacting preparation, confidence, and inclusion.

The new dressing room ensures reliable, dignified facilities for all teams, while also being available to visiting teams and, when required, the men’s club—maximising shared

community benefit. This investment removes a key barrier to participation, strengthens team morale, and supports player retention, particularly among younger girls.

By improving infrastructure, the project delivers strong value for money and long-term impact. The facility will be maintained through existing club structures, ensuring sustainability and continued community use.





## Strengthening rescue communications in remote areas



**€1,864**

awarded from the **Lenalea Community Benefit Fund**

Donegal Mountain Rescue Team has upgraded the electrical and data systems in its Incident Control Unit vehicle with support from the Lenalea Community Fund. A Starlink Roam kit and large battery pack are strengthening the team's ability to coordinate rescues and stay connected while operating in remote and mountainous areas.

Mobile coverage can be unreliable in locations including the upper part of Glenveagh National Park and the car park at the foot of the Errigal track. The satellite broadband system removes these coverage blackspots, enabling phone communications from critical control locations for the first time. This gives the Incident Control Unit greater confidence that it can remain in contact with team members and effectively coordinate operations when responding to incidents.

The battery pack also allows the team to phase out a petrol-powered generator that has been in service for more than ten years. It now powers the vehicle's communications and incident coordination systems, reducing noise, avoiding voltage spikes and lowering reliance on fossil fuels. The team's 35 active volunteers have already benefited from enhanced communications and coordination, with the long-term value of the investment set to grow as the equipment supports future rescues and helps the team continue saving lives across Donegal's remote communities.



## Lighting the way for year-round sport in Oughterard



**€31,094**

awarded from **Galway Wind Park Major Projects Fund**



With support from Galway Wind Park Major Projects Fund, Oughterard Rugby Club has installed four mobile, battery-powered LED lighting units to enable safer, more flexible year-round training.

Previously, the club relied on one partially lit pitch, limiting winter access and forcing teams to share space or travel to facilities in Galway City and Clifden. The new portable lighting can illuminate different areas of the pitch as needed, reducing pressure on playing surfaces and supporting consistent training for more than 200 members.

The system also delivers environmental and financial benefits by avoiding diesel generators, reducing energy costs, operating silently and fume-free, and cutting light pollution by up to 70%. The project strengthens local sports participation, player development and community wellbeing through a practical, lower-emission solution.



## Smart energy for a sustainable community space



**€6,470**

awarded from **Galway Wind Park Community Fund**



Coiste Páirc Spraoi Leitir Móir is creating a vibrant, inclusive public park on the Wild Atlantic Way that supports community wellbeing, accessibility and sustainability.

Following a 2024 Galway Wind Park Community Fund award of €10,600 for a 14.6kW ground-mounted solar PV system to power pathway lighting, the group received a further €6,470 to install an 8kW battery storage system. The battery will capture excess solar energy for later use, creating a more reliable off-grid solution, reducing reliance on external electricity and lowering ongoing energy costs.

By improving lighting during darker hours, the project supports a safer and more accessible space for recreation, events and cultural activity. The park is expected to benefit more than 20,000 people annually, including local residents, visitors across Connemara and seasonal tourists.



## Green skills for future careers



**£139,000**

awarded from **SSE Learning for Life Fund**

SSE and Greencoat UK Wind have awarded £139,000 through Round 2 of the SSE Learning for Life Fund, supporting two five-year programmes that will expand access to lifelong learning, green skills and low-carbon career pathways across Northern Ireland.

South West Regional College will receive £64,000 to deliver Green Futures for school pupils and post-19 learners with special educational needs.

Women's Tech will receive £75,000 to embed green skills, sustainability and climate literacy into training programmes for women and girls.

Running through to 2030/31, the Fund supports SSE's commitment to a just transition by linking community

investment with inclusive skills development, for communities connected to SSE and Greencoat UK Wind renewable energy assets.



# SSE Airtricity



In 2025, SSE Airtricity awarded €4.1 million and £0.5 million through its Generation Green Community Fund to support 56 fully-funded projects across the entire island of Ireland. Shaped by an extensive community consultation, the fund backs ambitious community-led action on climate education, biodiversity enhancement, energy efficiency, circular economy and green skills. With grants of up to €250,000, it enables organisations to deliver large, longer-term projects with deep local impact and national reach.

The fund focuses on two complementary strands aligned with Ireland's climate policies and objectives:

- **Education for a sustainable future** - investing in projects which empower young people and the broader community with the knowledge and skills needed to contribute to the Green Transition.
- **Community-led sustainability** – funding projects which empower local communities to lead and implement sustainability initiatives that ensure long term impact and local ownership.

The fund is a comprehensive initiative which ensures deep impact by providing communities with a range of support including social and economic capacity building, innovation showcases and collaborative partnerships.



## Providing sustainability education



**£93,196**

**awarded by Generation Green Community Fund**

Investing in the next generation's ability to confront the climate crisis is essential for communities across Northern Ireland. Business in the Community Northern Ireland is driving meaningful change by bridging the gap between business and education, delivering high-quality climate education to post-primary schools. This initiative empowers young people with the tools, confidence, and perspective to become leaders in sustainability, ensuring that every student can actively contribute to a greener future.

The Generation Green Schools Project is collaborating with 44 schools, reaching every corner of Northern Ireland and ensuring equitable access to impactful sustainability education. The programme equips pupils with comprehensive, practical understanding of urgent environmental challenges. Students move beyond classroom theory, engaging in hands-on projects and tackling real-world sustainability challenges. This approach not only deepens their understanding but also cultivates critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

By connecting schools across Northern Ireland, the Generation Green Schools project is setting a new standard for climate education: consistent, accessible, and relevant. This initiative provides the foundation for pupils to become active participants in shaping sustainable communities.





## Improving landowner biodiversity action



**€100,000**

awarded by Generation Green Community Fund

Reversing biodiversity loss demands coordinated action at every scale, from shaping national policies to revitalising the smallest patch of farmland. Burrenbeo Trust is using support from the Generation Green Community Fund to scale up their flagship Hare's Corner initiative, now reaching six counties and setting a new standard for community-led biodiversity recovery.

The project will implement over 1,500 biodiversity actions across Galway, Limerick, Sligo, Offaly, Carlow, and Meath. Landowners, including farmers, schools, and community groups, are empowered to transform species-poor sites into vibrant wildlife habitats. Successful participants gain access to woodland and orchard trees, personalised 'Plans for Nature' guidance, training webinars, and micro-funding. These

resources enable the creation of mini-woodlands, heritage orchards, and wildlife ponds, each strategically designed to deliver measurable biodiversity gains and ensure lasting ecological impact.

Coordinated by Burrenbeo Trust in partnership with biodiversity officers from all of the six counties, the initiative also leverages a panel of ecologists and hydrologists to guide complex habitat restoration. Over 800 participants are projected to actively engage in the program, representing a diverse range of landowners and community organisations. Each participant plays a direct role in restoring nature locally, collectively contributing to genuine, landscape-scale change that supports Ireland's commitment to reversing biodiversity loss.

The Hare's Corner initiative is an example that biodiversity recovery is not only possible, but achievable when communities are equipped with the right resources and support. This project is driving lasting environmental change, proving that local action can deliver national impact.



## Nurturing food growing schools



**€193,185**

awarded by Generation Green Community Fund

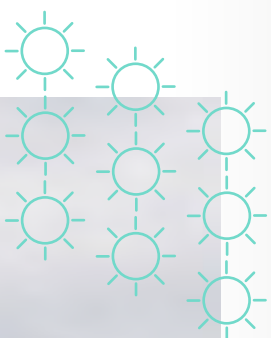
Grow It Yourself (GIY), a social enterprise based in Waterford, has a longstanding mission to inspire communities throughout Ireland to cultivate their own food and develop a deeper awareness of its origins. With support from the Generation Green Community Fund, GIY is now bringing that work into schools.

The GIY programme is partnering with 50 post-primary schools across Ireland, giving students the practical skills and environmental knowledge to understand food systems and their connection to sustainability. Each school receives raised beds, soil and seed varieties, establishing dedicated growing spaces on school grounds. Tailored growing plans

and educational resources are provided for the full academic year, helping to embed food-growing as a regular part of school life rather than a standalone event.

The curriculum covers modules on sustainable food systems, biodiversity, climate change, water use, composting and the role of STEM in agriculture. The content is aligned to the new Climate Action and Sustainable Development subjects, making integration into the school curriculum straightforward and relevant. A strong emphasis is placed on teacher support, offering professional training, access to an online hub, and in-person coaching. These resources are designed to empower educators to confidently deliver garden-based learning and connect these activities to broader climate-related topics.

By offering students the opportunity to grow their own food, trace its journey, and reflect on its environmental footprint, the GROW at School initiative is fostering a new generation who are both knowledgeable and actively engaged in food and sustainability issues.



## Enabling sustainable community services



**€70,678**  
awarded by Generation Green Community Fund

Cancer Care West is a leading charity providing essential community support services to families affected by cancer in the west of Ireland. Their comprehensive offering includes professional one-to-one counselling, group therapy sessions, accommodation, and transport, ensuring that individuals never face cancer alone. Recognising the need to future-proof their operations, Cancer Care West aims to deliver services in a more sustainable manner, aligning with their climate objectives.

Through a partnership with the Generation Green Community Fund, Cancer Care West has produced a robust Climate Action Plan for Inis Aoibhinn, their 33-bedroom facility located at University Hospital Galway. The awarded funding will support the installation of 22 solar panels, which are projected to significantly lower the carbon footprint of the organisation's energy consumption by 20% and contribute to reduced energy costs for their operations.

The improved facilities are expected to benefit over 430 patients annually, ensuring they receive high-quality support and care throughout their cancer treatment and recovery. This initiative not only advances Cancer Care West's environmental goals but also strengthens their ability to deliver compassionate services to those in need, demonstrating how sustainability and community wellbeing can go hand in hand.

## Creating a sustainable fashion hub



**€178,278**  
awarded by Generation Green Community Fund

Change Clothes has been working to promote sustainable fashion by preventing fashion waste within the community and offering creative reuse solutions for textiles at every stage of their lifecycle. With support from the Generation Green Community Fund, Change Clothes has developed a new community hub in Dublin 8 where they can grow their services and provide textile reuse, repair and upcycling.

The hub is open seven days a week and offers a permanent clothing swap shop where visitors can exchange clothes rather than throw them away. Alongside this, bi-weekly repair and upcycling workshops, monthly community repair cafés, and a walk-in affordable repair service give people practical ways to extend the life of their clothes. A public workspace provides access to textile equipment for anyone who wants to use it.

Over the course of a year, the hub is expected to benefit around 12,700 people through its range of activities. By making sustainable fashion practical and accessible, Change Clothes is helping to shift attitudes towards clothing consumption in a way that makes sense for people's everyday lives.

# SSE Thermal

Since April 2024, when SSE Thermal launched its first thermal-powered Community Benefit Fund in Ireland, the company has awarded €50,000 in funding, supporting 31 community projects.

The fund supports community and charitable projects in and around Great Island, with a particular focus on the communities closest to our power station including Great Island, Campile and Cheekpoint. The fund makes €25,000 available each year and prioritises projects that strengthen local services, improve community facilities, support biodiversity and the natural environment, and help organisations reduce energy use.

In 2025/26, the fund continued to support a broad range of local projects that respond to practical community needs and strengthen the places people use every day. Awards supported improvements to shared facilities, safer access to local amenities, youth and volunteer-led activity, environmental initiatives and projects that help communities make better use of local assets.

## Supporting youth facilities

12th Wexford Ballykelly Scouts is upgrading its scout hall to improve the safety, functionality and long-term use of the building. The den, a former primary school, requires a range of works including improvements to toilets, kitchen facilities, windows, storage and fire safety arrangements.

The investment will help create a safer and more welcoming space for young people to meet, learn and take part in scouting activities. By improving a well-used local facility, the project supports youth development, volunteering and wider community use, helping ensure the hall remains a practical asset for Ballykelly and the surrounding area.

## Improving safe access to the water

awarded to Cheekpoint Boat Owners Association

Cheekpoint Boat Owners Association is improving the safety and usability of the Cheekpoint Community Pontoon through the purchase and installation of fixed fendering. The pontoon has become an important local asset, providing safe access to the water for local and visiting boats and supporting activity around Cheekpoint Harbour.

The new fendering will provide additional protection for watercraft using the facility, particularly in changing tidal and weather conditions. By strengthening this community infrastructure, the project supports safer access to the harbour, improves the visitor experience and helps maintain Cheekpoint's connection to its maritime heritage and local tourism activity.

## Enhancing village biodiversity

awarded to Campile Area Development Group

Campile Area Development Group is delivering a practical community project to enhance public spaces across the village. Funding will support the purchase of a compost tumbler, creating a shared resource that residents can use freely while encouraging local composting, waste reduction and more sustainable use of green materials.

The project builds on the group's ongoing work to improve the village environment through clean-ups, planting and public space enhancements. By making composting more visible and accessible, it supports biodiversity, community participation and environmental awareness, while helping Campile residents take small, practical steps towards a more sustainable village.
